Indie Grits and Donen Film Festivals Bring Best of Cutting Edge Film to Columbia

The First Annual Donen Film Festival and the Indie Grits Film Festival will be held May 30 – June 3, 2007. Over these four days, the festivals will bring a range of cutting-edge film to Columbia, in venues across the city.

The Donen Film Festival, named in honor of Academy Award winning, Columbia native Stanley Donen, will spotlight works from prominent South Carolina filmmakers. Alex English Jr.'s *Lumera* will kick off the festival with a screening at the Columbia Museum of Art on May 31. Greenville filmmaker Jeff Sumeral will host a program of his latest work as well as a discussion on independent filmmaking at the

Nickelodeon Theatre on June 1. The festival will conclude with a grand screening of Julian Adam's *The Last Confederate: The Story of Robert Adams* on the grounds of the Hampton Preston Mansion on the evening of June 2. The Indie Grits Film Festival will take place concurrently with the Donen Film Festival, and will feature screenings of cutting-edge, independent film and video from all across the Southeast.

Andy Smith, Executive Director of the First Annual Donen Film Festival and the Indie Grits Film Festival, added, "We are proud to honor Stanley Donen's amazing career with this festival. We understand that Mr. Donen

was strongly influenced by all of the films he watched as a child, right here in Columbia. We hope that by bringing more film-related events like the Donen and Indie Grits Film Festival to Columbia, we'll be encouraging and influencing the development of the next Stanley Donen." Mayor Coble Promotes Retail Strategy

Mayor Bob Coble has been expressing his plans for further development of downtown retail. Coble has taken over where Terry Brown, CEO of Edens & Avant and Vice Chairman of City Center Partnership, left off last November. Brown had asked the city for more assistance with retail incentives, amenities, and tax-increment financing, in hopeful efforts of enticing developers to take more risks with larger retail projects downtown.

Coble reinforces Brown's message, and while speaking to the

Columbia Rotary Club last month, he narrowed it down to the following five issues: 1) Effective coordination with the private sector; 2) The correct mix of incentives such as loans and façade grants, and tax-increment financing that must come into play to help pay for streetscaping and green space; 3) A better job by the city in making parking more customer friendly, even with additional parking planned and under construction; 4) Security and the perception of security; 5) A new signage system for the downtown area, called the Wayfinder Program, which has already been approved and paid for.

The City Center Partnership and the city are looking forward to embarking on this dynamic retail initiative. Mayor Coble's remarks follow a recent trip to Austin, Texas to study their retail initiative with a delegation that included Jim Apple, Chairman of City Center Partnership; Matt Kennell, President and CEO; Frank Lourie, a longstanding merchant and board member; Jim Gambrell, Director of City of Columbia's Office of Economic Development; and Councilman E.W. Cromartie.
